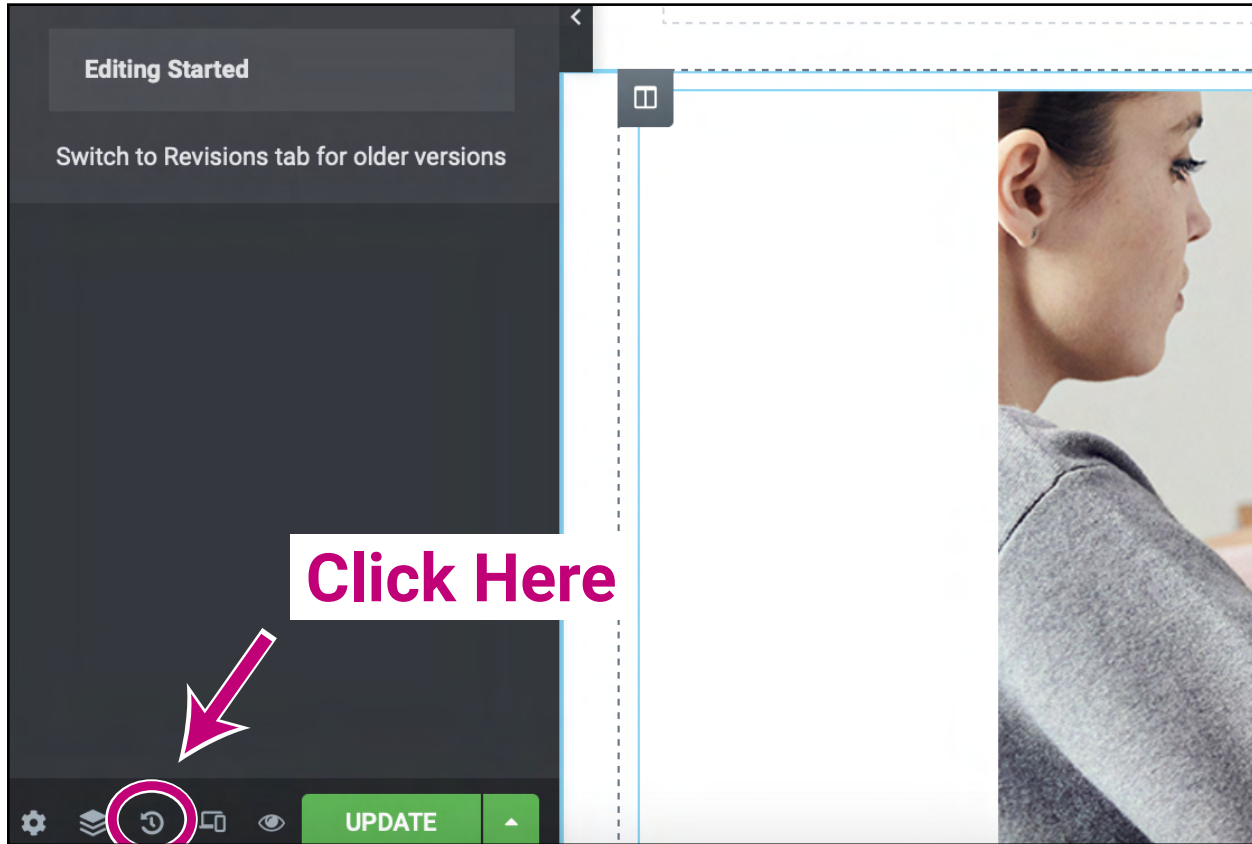



EDITING POSTS: UNDO ACTIONS

1. To undo a recent edit, look to the editing sidebar and you will find an icon that looks like a clock with a circular arrow around it.



2. Select the icon and a chronological history of all the actions that you made since opening the document will appear, along with brief details about each action.

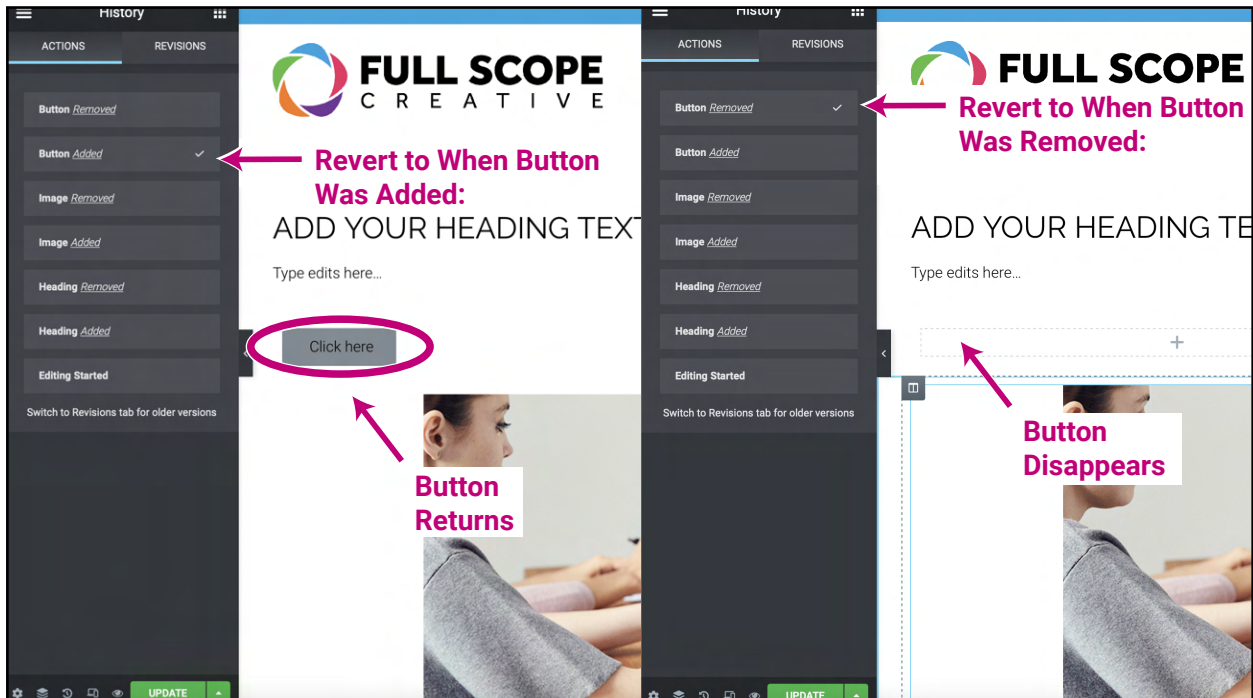

- Don't click out of the "History" tab until you are sure you want to undo your action. If you click away, you can't go back to the actions that you decided to undo.
- After you are sure you made the correct edits, click the green "Update" button
